WHAT IS SPUR?

Building on all the best of the previous CMS SummerView conferences, we are now relaunching CMS SummerView as SPUR: CMS Global Mission Conference.

SPUR wants to see an increasing number of Tasmanian Christians spurred on to pray, care and give to those who go to the nations with God's gospel of grace.

Like SummerView previously, SPUR is an opportunity for Christians across Tasmania to experience outstanding Bible and mission teaching. We want to better understand God's work in bringing about *a world that knows Jesus*.

You will be inspired to greater involvement in global and local disciple-making. You will gain an international perspective on mission challenges and opportunities in the Indian Ocean, South Africa, and Cambodia.

Through mission-focused seminars and electives, you will be biblically and practically helped by gospel workers on Home Assignment, and others in the CMS fellowship. We will explore topics that equip us as individuals and churches to be involved in God's global mission.

Missionary sharing

Jacobson, serving in Cambodia and Kylie
Zietsch, serving in South Africa, will explain
the mission joys, challenges and opportunities
in their location and ministries. Other CMS
Tasmania gospel workers will sharing from
mission locations via video. There will be inperson mission interviews of those taking the
next mission steps with CMS, and those back
from short-term mission work.



Electives

On Thursday and Friday afternoons there will be optional electives presented by gospel workers on Home Assignment, and others in the CMS fellowship. They will explore topics that will equip us as individuals, and as churches, to better be involved in God's global mission priorities.

YOUNG PEOPLE AT SPUR

Children will be looked after in their own creche (6m-4yrs), primary (prep-grade 6) and high school (grades 7-10) programs, which will run during the main sessions and mission presentations (but not during the evening or elective sessions). The high schoolers will have mentors to guide their learning as they attend the missionary keynote presentations alongside the adults. Parents can bring their children to the evening and elective sessions if desired. Pencils and colour in activities will be provided. High schoolers will benefit from the electives and evening sessions, and are most welcome.

Many conference attendees, missionaries and keynote speakers stay next door to the conference venue at the **Big 4 Launceston Holiday Park**. This year, CMS has reserved all cabins. Book early as they will sell out.
