SPUR wants to see an increasing number of Tasmanian Christians spurred on to pray, care and give to those who go to the nations with God's gospel of grace.

The conference is an opportunity for Christians across Tasmania to experience outstanding Bible and mission teaching and better understand God's work in bringing about a world that knows Jesus. You and your church will be inspired to greater involvement in global and local disciple-making. You'll be given an international perspective on mission challenges and opportunities across the globe.

Through mission-focused seminars and workshops, you'll be biblically and practically helped by gospel workers back from the field, and others in the CMS fellowship. We will explore topics that equip us as individuals and churches to be involved in God's global mission.

SPEAKERS



Kanishka Raffel

Born in London to Sri Lankan parents and raised as a Buddhist, while studying law at Sydney University, Kanishka read a copy of John's Gospel and became a Christian.

Kanishka will be our conference preacher. He is currently serving as the Anglican Archbishop of Sydney where he desires to see the Anglican Sydney diocese strengthening local churches, discipling the next generation, and raising up and training ministers of the gospel.

Missionary sharing

Chris and Karen Webb help Aboriginal people in Broome become faithful disciples of Jesus through sharing life and teaching God's word with them. B serves in the Middle East as a secure worker among Muslim people. Tasmanian missionaries will share from their mission locations via video. There will also be in-person interviews with new CMS TAS gospel workers Andy and Rachel, and Y.

GLOBAL WORKSHOPS

On Thursday and Friday afternoons there will be workshops presented by gospel workers back from the field, and others in the CMS fellowship. They will explore topics that will equip us as individuals, and as churches, to play our part in God's global mission.

YOUNG PEOPLE AT SPUR

Children will be looked after in creche (6m–4yrs), primary (prep–grade 6) and high school (grades 7–10) programs, which will run during the main sessions and mission presentations (but not during the evening or elective sessions). The high schoolers will have mentors to guide their learning as they attend the missionary keynote presentations alongside the adults. Parents can bring their children to the evening and elective sessions. Pencils and colouring in activities will be provided. High schoolers will benefit from the electives and evening sessions and are most welcome.
