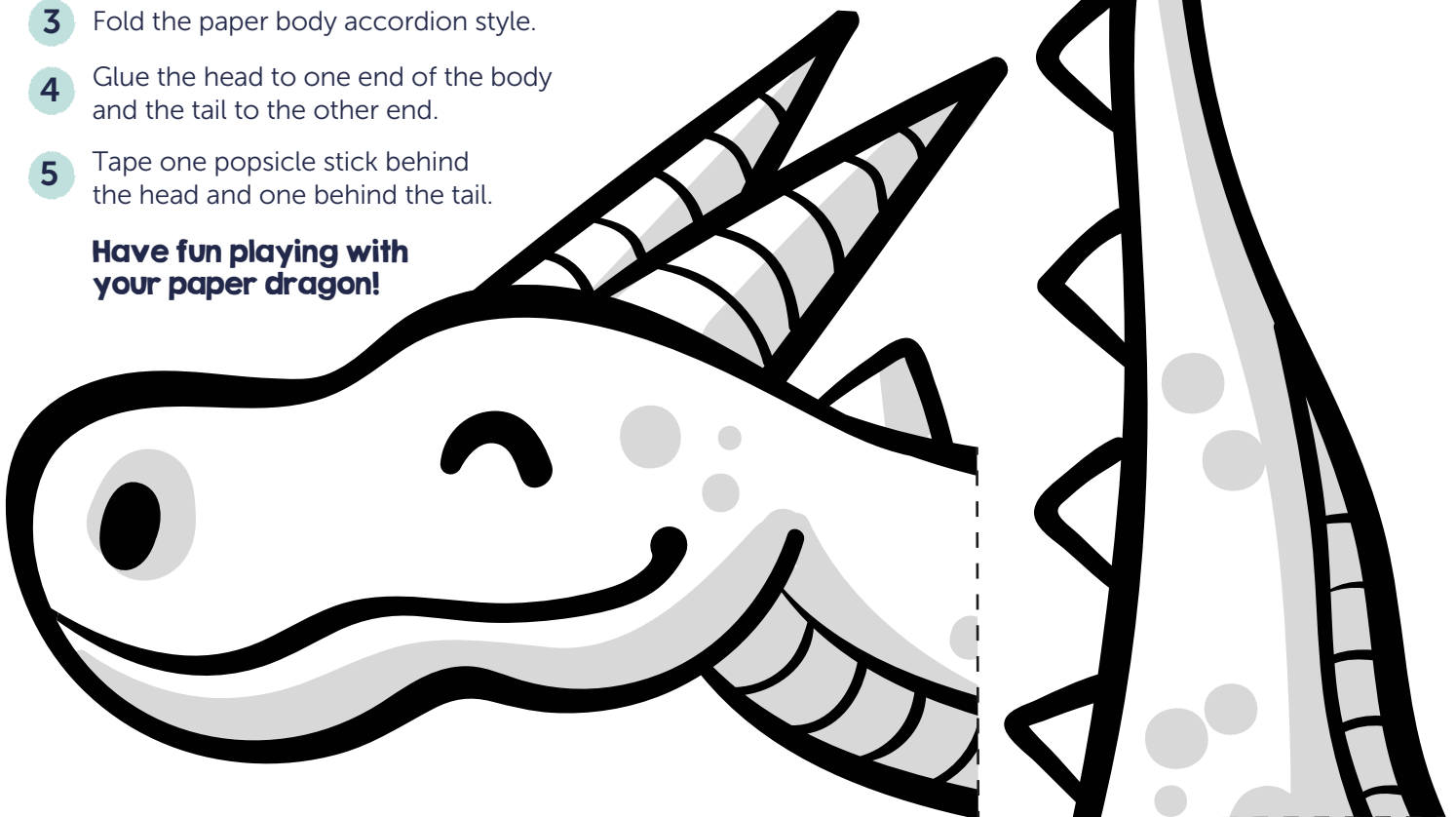
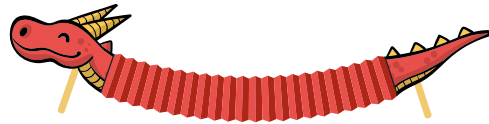

ACTIVITY

The dragon is an important symbol in Asian countries. People believe it represents good luck and strength. Make your own paper dragon using the instructions below:

You will need: a piece of paper, scissors, 2 popsicle sticks, colour pencils or textas, glue stick and tape. Ask an adult if you need help cutting with the scissors.

- 1 Colour in then cut out the dragon head and tail on this page.
- 2 Take a sheet of paper and cut out a rectangle 5cm wide and at least 20cm long. This is the dragon's body. You can colour and draw patterns here.
- 3 Fold the paper body accordion style.
- 4 Glue the head to one end of the body and the tail to the other end.
- 5 Tape one popsicle stick behind the head and one behind the tail.



Have fun playing with your paper dragon!

More than 45 billion pairs of chopsticks are produced every year in Asia.

Using chopsticks involves over 30 joints and 50 muscles in the fingers, wrist, arm and shoulders!

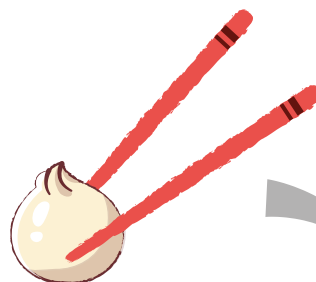
PRAY
